Dry Falls Visitor Center

Located within 2 hours of Canyon River Ranch is one of the natural wonders of North America. The Dry Falls Cataract is a 3.5 mile chasm of basalt with a 400 foot drop. This was left thousands of years ago by one of the last ice ages floods that came through the Grand Coulee. To see panoramic views of the Dry Falls, visit the historic Vista House Overlook. The dormant Ice Age waterfall has left behind a series of plunge pool which are now ground-fed Oases for nearby wildlife. It is said to be one of the most extraordinary landscapes to be found along the Ice Age Floods National Geologic Trail.






Features

Directions

Head northwest on Canyon River Road until you reach I-90. Take I-90 East towards Vantage/Spokane. Take exit 151 toward Ephrata Soap Lake/WA-283 N. Continue onto WA-281, then turn right onto WA- 283 N. Turn left onto WA-17 N (signs for Soap Lake/Grand Coulee Dam)

Discover Pass is required for parking. Admission to the park is free however donations are accepted.
